Accordingly by the order of the Honourable Vice Chancellor, the Academic Audit Team of the Sidho-Kanho-Birsha University, Purulia has conducted the Academic Audit in the college on 03rd July, 2024. The said audit is based on the data and information supplied by the college authority for the period from 2020 to the date of audit (2022-23). - b) Feedback from the faculty does not receive in a proper manner,
- c) Anonymous Feedback from the students is collected every year, after which these are analysed by the IQAC and placed before the Academic sub-committee and subsequently with the Governing Body of the college for their consideration and policy formation.

Remark: Satisfactory performances have been exhibited. However, college has to collect the feedback forms in proper manner from the teachers and students (department wise) on regular basis.

Overall Observations and Recommendations:

The University Audit Team has thoroughly checked and verified the documentary evidences in support of all the activities and things mentioned in this Audit Report. At the time of visit to the college, the Audit Team has met separately all the major stakeholders. Physical verifications have been conducted in respect of all items that were placed by the college authority before the Audit Team. The Audit Team has received all required explanations and clarifications from the college authority.

The authority of the college extended all sorts of co-operations to conduct the academic audit smoothly. The audit team expresses its hearty thanks to them. The principal, members of IQAC, teachers and other staff and the students of the college extended their whole-hearted support for conducting this academic audit. On the whole it can be remarked

that there are good number of things/ activities/practices to the credit of the college that have direct or indirect impact on the improvement of academic climate as well as standards of the college.

At the same time, some flaws are also observed. In the opinion of the Academic Audit Team, the following are the things/areas of strengths and weaknesses of the college.

Things/Areas of Strengths:

- (a) There are very active NSS unit.
- (b) There are Playground, Gymnasium and arrangements for different games and sports;
- (c) There are friendly and cordial relationships among the teachers, students and other staff of the college;
- (d) There are plenty of endeavours of the management of the college to up-lift academic environment and standards.

Things/Areas of Weaknesses:

- (a) The college is situated in the remote area of Purulia District, so, the college is not convenient geographical location and communication;
- (b) Mostly first-generation learners come here;
- (c) The cleanliness all over the campus should be enhanced;
- (d) There is a lack of adequate fulltime teaching and non-teaching staffs.
- (e) In Honours subjects there are wide spread disparities in respect of intake for admission, number of students admitted and number of students appeared in the final examination.
- (f) Practical based departments are to be well equipped with sophisticated instruments as per course curriculum

Assessment and Accreditation

After the audit and assessment, the team unanimously put the accreditation to the college as 'Good' (56%).
